

Ovarian cancer is difficult to detect in its early stages. Routine pelvic exams detect only 1 in 10,000 ovarian cancers in asymptomatic patients. Roswell Park's **High Risk Ovarian Cancer Clinic** helps women who are at increased risk be proactive in catching the disease before it progresses.
