Discharge Instructions: Wide Local Excisions and Skin Grafts

What To Expect

• You may have a sore throat after the procedure because of the breathing tube used during surgery. This will go away over the next few days.

Wound Care

- You will have a large dressing (bolster) over the surgical site, and a dressing over the donor skin graft site.
- Do not remove the large bolster dressing. Do not remove the dressing from the donor skin graft site (usually located on the upper chest or thigh).
- You may bathe, however, try to keep the bolster from getting saturated, and keep the donor site dressing as dry as possible.
- It is normal to have a small amount of oozing from the incision or the skin graft donor site for the first 1-2 days. You may ooze reddish-colored fluid, especially if you take a blood thinner like aspirin, warfarin, or Xarelto[™], but you should not have fresh bleeding like you'd see with a deep cut.

Pain Control

- We will provide you with a prescription for opioid pain medication such as hydrocodone with acetaminophen (Norco[®]), oxycodone with acetaminophen (Percocet[®]), or oxycodone (Oxycontin[®]). Take it every 4-6 hours if you are having pain. If opioid medications are too strong, you can take acetaminophen (Tylenol[®]). You may take ibuprofen (Advil[®]/Motrin[®]) after the first 1-2 days. Follow the instructions on the bottle.
- If you take an opioid medication that contains acetaminophen, do not take additional acetaminophen. The maximum daily dose of acetaminophen is 4000 milligrams. Check all medication labels. Acetaminophen may be an ingredient in over-the-counter and prescription medications.

Recovery

- The area where you had surgery will be sore for several days.
- You may be hoarse or have a sore throat for a few days.
- Do not lift anything that weighs more than 5 pounds and no strenuous activities for 3 weeks.
- Do not drive (or operate heavy machinery) if you are taking opioid pain medication.
- You can gradually return to your normal activities after 2 weeks, as tolerated.

Call Us If...

- you have bleeding that does not stop after you apply pressure on the area
- you develop severe, uncontrolled pain at the site of your surgery
- the area around the incision or biopsy site becomes inflamed or reddened or has increased drainage
- you have a fever of 101°F (38°C) or higher
