

Discharge Instructions: Chest Port Placement

What to Expect

- Slight pain/soreness at site for 24-48 hours
- Slight bloody drainage
- Low-grade fever of 99°-100°F (32.7°-37.7°C)

You Can...

- restart your medications right away (hold blood thinners for 24 hours, this includes aspirin and ibuprofen/Advil®)
- take acetaminophen (Tylenol®) or other prescribed pain medications
- apply ice to chest port site if experiencing pain (on for 10 minutes, off for 20 minutes, and repeat while awake)
- restart your regular diet

Restrictions

Do NOT...

- drive or drink alcohol for 24 hours
- strain, perform strenuous activity, or lift anything heavier than 10 pounds for 7 days
- raise the arm of the affected side above shoulder level (more than 90 degrees) until the incision is healed (about 5 days)
- remove the Steri-strips™ if present they will fall off over time

Wound Care

•	Cover dressings with plastic wrap before taking a shower for 5 days
•	On day 2, remove all dressings and replace bottom dressing only
•	On day 5, remove bottom dressing and leave dressing off
•	If the chest port is used within 5 days, have the nurse recover the site with a gauze and Tegaderm.

Call Us If ...

- the chest port site has redness, pus, pain not relieved by medication (signs of infection), or excessive bleeding
- you have a fever over 100.4°F (38°C) with chills that lasts longer than 24 hours
