

Online Resources for Peritoneal Cancer



Ovarian epithelial cancer, fallopian tube cancer, and **primary peritoneal cancer** form in the same kind of tissue and are treated in the same way.

Your peritoneum is a membrane, a sheet of smooth tissue that lines your abdominal and pelvic cavity and surrounds your abdominal organs. It pads and insulates your organs, helps hold them in place and secretes a lubricating fluid to reduce friction when they rub against each other.
