WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

Cancer rates and trends can vary from place to place. Here in Western New York the top four cancers are lung, breast, prostate and colorectal.

In addition, specific groups of us — African-Americans, Native Americans, Hispanics, refugees and those with lower socioeconomic status — face an increased risk for developing cancer and a greater burden from the disease, such as poorer survival.




White women get breast cancer more often, but African-American women die more often from the disease.



African-American men develop prostate cancer more than any other group and are two times more likely to die from it compared to white men.




