

Help Our Patients by Donating Blood

During their treatment, cancer patients often need blood or blood products, such as platelets. A reliable daily supply ready for transfusion is essential.



Both their disease and treatments can result in blood loss and anemia, or low levels of certain blood cell types. A cancer patient may require a transfusion to address effects from:

- Blood loss during surgery
- Leukemia and other cancers that begin in the bone marrow, where blood cells are created
 - Chemotherapy drugs
 - Radiation treatments to large areas of bone
 - Transplant treatments such as Bone Marrow Transplant (BMT) or Peripheral blood stem cell transplant (PBSCT)

HOW YOU CAN HELP

Saving lives is easy and rewarding. You may choose to make any of these donations at RPCI:

- Donate blood. A whole blood donation takes about 45 minutes. You may donate whole blood every 56 days.
- Donate Platelets. Platelets, which provide the clotting factor in blood, have a shelf life of only 5 days. Platelets are needed patients with leukemia, those receiving chemotherapy or undergoing bone marrow transplantation. Donation takes about 1.5 to 2 hours. You may donate platelets every 2 weeks.
- Donate Platelets/Red Cells. Donating two critical blood components simultaneously (platelets and red blood cells) can benefit multiple patients. Donation takes approximately 2 hours and you may donate every 56 days.

The shelf life for blood is short. Blood and platelets are needed everyday at RPCI.

the process that separates out one specific blood component, such as platelets, from the blood.

Donor Criteria

You must be in good general health and:

- At least 17 years old
- Weigh a minimum of 110 pounds
- Not have donated blood in the past 56 days
- Not had a tattoo in the past 12 months
- Have eaten a meal at least 1 to 2 hours before donation
