Who Gets Breast Cancer?

Anyone can get breast cancer, even men. The causes of breast cancer remain unclear, but some factors place you at **high risk** for the disease such as:

- A family history of breast cancer among your parents, siblings or at least two other close relatives
- A personal or family history of ovarian cancer
- Multiple cancers within your family
- A relative diagnosed with breast cancer before menopause
- A known mutation, such as BRCA1, BRCA2, TP53, or PTEN in your family
- An abnormal breast biopsy
- Prior radiation to the chest
- Increased breast density

Treatment the RPCI Way

We believe every patient is unique and we approach cancer treatment on an individual and personal basis, treating the whole person, not just the cancer.

We offer the highest level of breast cancer care, including:

- **A comprehensive multidisciplinary approach** by a team of breast cancer surgeons, medical and radiation oncologists, psychologists, social workers, geneticists, plastic & reconstructive surgeons, and other experts who work collaboratively—all under one roof.
- **Radioactive seed localization**, an innovative procedure to help your surgeon locate cancers and other breast abnormalities too small to feel. Roswell Park is the only WNY center to offer this new, more patient-friendly approach to pinpointing and removing very small breast cancers.
- **Breast conserving surgery** for the majority of patients with Stage I and II disease and one-third of patients with Stage III cancer.
- **Specialty radiation therapies** including brachytherapy (radioactive seeds), External Beam Radiotherapy (EBRT) and Accelerated Partial Breast Irradiation.
- **The latest treatments available** including targeted therapy, immunotherapy, hormone therapy and clinical research studies.
- **Treatments for metastatic disease** such as Gamma Knife, bone strengthening treatments, antiestrogen therapy, radiotherapy to distant sites.
