### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our society is currently awakening to the special needs of the dying and their loved ones. Health care professionals and faith communities are developing the will to confront dying and to help those who entered this very important part of life. Too often the dying and their loved ones do not have the support they need in facing the personal, emotional and spiritual issues that surround death. Also, after the death of a loved one, people become lost on a journey called grief and seek out others to help them find their way. This course is designed for people who want the theoretical and practical tools to make these two things happen.

### COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Become familiar with the emotional, psychological and spiritual responses to dying and the bereaved.
- Identify the theoretical basis for responding to individuals facing death as well as the families after the death of a loved one.
